Math Challenge

READING:

Incoming 1st Grade:

- Create a picture timeline of all the events in the book, labeling each of the events to provide facts, definitions, or important points taking place.
- After reading a book select the 5 most important words in the book and explain why
 these words are important to the main idea(s) or information presented.

Incoming 2nd/3rd The reading journal

Incoming 4th Grade:

- Create a picture timeline of all the events in the book, labeling each of the events to provide facts, definitions, or important points taking place
- Write a friendly letter to the main character asking questions and reacting to the events in the story.

Incoming 5th Grade

- Draw a map of the book's setting and explain how it contributes to the meaning, mood, tone, and beauty of the text.
- Create a timeline using drawings, magazine cutouts, pictures, and labels to show the
 main events, and how these events contribute to the meaning of the text. This activity
 can be done either on Office 365 using Microsoft Word or Power point or can be done
 on construction paper.
